REP FOR SPRING

Last month we talked about spring cleaning in the home but it is also a great time to prep the outside of your home as well. Here are somethings to keep in mind for seasonal changes. Remember April showers, bring May flowers; but we also want to help prevent flooding and pollution.

YARD WASTE

There are many ways to deal with yard waste but why should you worry about it? If yard waste (grass clippings, leaves, brush, trash) is left along streets, driveways, and sidewalks, then when it rains all of that waste is washed to storm drains. This can cause storm drains to become blocked and risk flooding. Plus, grass clippings and leaves can add too much nitrogen and phosphate into our water ways. Excess phosphorous and nitrogen added to surface waters can lead to cloudy, green water from accelerated algae and weed growth. Decay of this extra organic matter can depress oxygen levels, killing organisms.

Try these uses for grass clippings and leaves: add them to your compost, use them as mulch, use them as a filler for raised garden beds, leave grass clippings on your lawn to add nutrients back into it, or even use grass clippings to naturally dye fabric or Easter eggs!

And please remeber this ordinance!

953.11 - No person shall throw, place or scatter any garbage, rubbish, trash, grass clippings, leaves or yard debris or other refuse over or upon any premises, street or alley, sewer or drainage basin, either public or private, or adjacent thereto...

VEHICLES

With warmer weather comes wanting to wash winter grime off your vehicles. Opt for an environmentally friendly soap and wash your car in the grass or at a car wash verses in your driveway or the street.

Always clean up vehicle leaks promptly and dispose of oil, anti-freeze and other vehicle waste properly! You can call WV DEP to

CHECK YOUR GUTTERS

Your home's gutters are very important. Gutters are responsible for funneling the water off of the roof and away from your home (but ideally not onto your neighbors or sidewalks).

Cleaning your gutters regularly, even if you have gutter guards, is a great way to prep for those spring showers. You can hire a service to clean your gutters or doing it yourself can save you \$100 or more. Plan to clean gutters at least twice a year-more often if the roof is directly beneath trees or you live in a region with frequent storms. But only take on this task if you can work safely from a ladder or the roof. If your roof is higher than a single story, you're better off hiring a gutter-cleaning pro.

PET WASTE

Yes, it has been cold outside so maybe you slacked on cleaning up pet waste over winter. So, get out there and clean them up! But why, you ask? Pet waste is more than just stinky, it contains bacteria and parasites, as well as organic matter and nutrients, notably nitrogen and phosphorous. The organic matter and nutrients contained in pet waste can degrade water quality by using up oxygen and releasing ammonia. Low oxygen levels, increased ammonia, and warm summer water temperatures can kill fish.
